*Additional information on the lesser known glasses:

LOTS 64-70 Bird & Butterfly An extensive series of vintage glasses, all with same graphic of bird and butterfly: The Baltimore Oriole, The Blue Jay, The Cardinal, The Goldfinch. At least seven different size glasses and a rare matching Anchor Hocking pitcher. The Cardinal is definitely more common.

LOTS 137-139 & 158 These glasses are featured on pages 158-159 of the book. They are rare, quite colorful and many collectors include them. They may be Dauntless PB (Hulman Co.) since they are the correct size and usually show up in the Dauntless sales area - OH-IN-IL-MI where Dauntless fruits are most often found.

LOT 200Z Recently, three Boscul flower glasses with original Boscul lids and containing 7 ounces of Salted Peanuts surfaced. Boscul marketed Salted Peanuts in flower glasses! Who knew? A Poinsettia and a Carnation are in collections, this very rare Iris sells.

LOT 248 Yellow Name Birds This set of five bird glasses is pictured on the website: Baltimore Oriole, Blue Jay, Cardinal, Meadow Lark (selling) and Robin. All with yellow script name at bottom. The most colorful bird set (up to six colors on a glass) and the most rare.

LOT 257 The 12 Orchids on pages 137-138 were purchased near Clarion, PA, along with seven other very rare glasses. They represent the ONLY big top name Orchids known, and the ONLY Boscul peanut glasses known with a big name at the bottom. They originally came from the home of a factory worker (now deceased) at the Owens-Illinois Glass Factory at Clarion. This factory supplied glasses to the Wm. Scull Co. in Camden, NJ where they were packed with Boscul peanut butter. Most of these Orchids are now in various collections.

LOTS 301-310 Color Craft State Glasses Vintage set of 9 state tea glasses. Will post on website soon. Colorful and with fascinating facts about each state - not rare but hard to find.

LOTS 338-345 Race Horses These are most likely another numbered series of Velvet PB. There are three variations of these and they will be pictured on the website later. All are hard to find.

LOTS 397-403 Boscul Tea Bag Glasses Big, bright and colorful, these glasses sold filled with Boscul tea bags. Pictured on the inside front cover of the book (hardcover only) with original lid. Usually found in the Boscul sales area, but hard to find; seems to be eight in set.
