DISCLAIMER: With so many glasses to list, it is very possible not all issues have been identified. PLEASE check the glasses you are interested in carefully. The following glasses are identified with issues and sell "as is": Lots 13, 18, 59, 75, 81, 179, 295, 306, 354, 497. Do not usually offer glasses with issues but these are hard to find, some have factory flaws. The correct identification of each glass by the book is also challenging, and it is quite possible not all are correctly IDed. You are welcome to bring a glass from your collection to compare.

***Notes**

- Lot 211: One of three 4" juice glasses in this series purchased online from Indonesia. Have seen no others.
- Lots 213-214: These Anchor Hocking pitchers are an exact match for Bird & Butterfly tumblers. One matches the tea glasses with green and yellow leaves, the other matches the black & white tumblers. These are the only Bird & Butterfly pitchers I have found.
- Lots 225, 233, 235, 237, 243, 246: There are distinct variations in Boscul juice glasses. These are pictured on the website and six variations sell.
- Lot 261: New discovery, 5 1/2" Santa with Train, an extremely rare size variation.
- Lots 322, 323: The Scarlet Tanager was pictured on ebay with a Club House peanut butter label in this exact glass. The Kingfisher is a matching glass. Are there more in this set?
- Lot 332-335: A newly discovered Game Bird set. Made by Federal Glass Co. and identical in size and shape to the Everglades Birds set on page 173. Purchased a boxed set of eight (two of each), have never seen any of these before. Very colorful and quite rare.
- Lot 346: The only example I have seen of another brand of peanut butter (Battleship) labelled Wm. S. Scull, the maker of Boscul. Battleship was a brand marketed in Ohio and Boscul had a division located in Dayton, OH.
- Lot 347: Have another of these rare labelled jars with a price on the lid of 49¢ for 1 lb. 2 oz. Going by price this would be circa 1960s at the time the flower glasses were being phased out.
- Lot 429: Rare and unusual variation of the Basset Hound in the History series. Red in color, no history and slightly different graphics.
